Together they raised 7 children, Robert Woods, Jr. and his wife Karen of Munsonville, NH, Cindy Woods Theberge and her husband Robert of Merrimack, Ronald Woods and his wife Susan of AL, Doug Woods and his wife Kim of Merrimack, Eric Woods of GA, Chris Woods and his wife Terry of Merrimack, and Diane Woods of OH.
